





Saul and his assistants strode purposefully down the road. They were headed for the famous old city of Damascus. Official letters they carried gave them permission to capture Christians. Then they would take them back to Jerusalem, where they would be put to death.

The hot noonday sun blazed down on the travellers. But they marched steadily on. They were intent on their mission even though they were tired. They had travelled almost 150 miles in the past few days. Now Damascus was almost within sight.

Then with no warning at all, in the middle of this very ordinary day, it happened! A beam of light flashed down from heaven! It was far, far brighter than the noonday sun. The travellers fell to the ground in shock. Saul stared into the astonishing brightness.



And then Jesus spoke to him. "Saul, Saul," Jesus said, "why do you persecute Me?"


Saul looked around too. But he couldn't see a thing. He was blind! Absolutely, totally blind! He turned his head from side to side. "I can't see!" he whispered.

Martin Luther

Story – Nailing the Thesis on the door or other story on Martin Luther



The Reformation was a time period when the Catholic Church split to form a new type of Christianity called Protestantism. In those days most people had no Bibles. Very few people other than monks and priests knew how to read and write. However, with the reformation, more and more people became educated and learned how to read. At the same time, the printing press was invented allowing for new ideas, as well as scriptures of the Bible, to be easily printed and distributed. People were able to read the Bible for themselves for the first time.

Martin Luther was a priest, began to question the practices of the Catholic Church as he studied the Bible. He found many areas where he felt the Bible and the Catholic Church disagreed. On October 31, 1517 Luther took a list of 95 points where he thought the Church had gone wrong and nailed it to the door of a Catholic Church.

One of the practices that Luther disagreed with was the paying of indulgences, that is going to church and paying money for your sins to be forgiven. This practice allowed people to be forgiven of their sins when they paid the church money. After Luther nailed his list to the Church, the Catholics began to make less money. This made them mad. They kicked him out of the church and called him a heretic, someone who teaches lies. This may not sound bad today, but in those times heretics were often put to death.

Luther wanted to make Reform Spreads through Northern Europe. Many people agreed with Martin Luther that the Catholic Church had become corrupt. Much of northern Europe began to separate from the Catholic Church. Several new churches were formed such as the Lutheran Church and the Reformed Church. Also new reform leaders such as John Calvin in Switzerland spoke out against the Catholic Church. In a separate split from the Catholic Church, the Church of England split from the Roman Catholic Church. This was over a different issue. King Henry VIII wanted to divorce his wife because she did not produce a male heir for him, but the Catholic Church would not let him. He decided to split from the Roman Catholics and create his own church called the Church of England which would allow him to get a divorce.

Sadly, arguments over the Reformation finally led to a series of wars. Some rulers were converted to Protestantism while others still supported the Catholic Church. The Thirty Years War was fought in Germany, Martin Luther's home, and involved nearly every country in Europe. The war was devastating which led to a lot of the German people being killed.

Ellen White

Story – Holding up the Bible



The Bible Ellen called for after this experience in her home in Portland was, presumably, the "big Bible" now in the White Estate vault with the names of Robert and Eunice Harmon stamped in gold on the spine. This Bible is 18 inches (46 centimeters) long, 11 inches (28 centimeters) wide, four inches (10 centimeters) thick, and weighs 18Ω pounds (seven kilograms). On one occasion, during family prayers in 1845, Ellen stepped over to a bureau upon which this large volume rested and picked it up. Placing it on her left hand, she easily held it with her arm extended for an estimated half hour. During the vision she referred, in short exclamations, to the value of the Word of God. Although in frail health she was in no way fatigued by the experience.

Creating postcards in response to the Scriptures we are studying is a creative way of helping us to crystallize our ideas about a text or concept and to share these ideas with others. The postcards also provide a graphic illustrating our response to the Scriptures at different times. You don't have to be artistic because simpler images are often the most thought provoking.

THINGS YOU NEED:

- Bibles
- Selection of postcards to give you some ideas of the kind of artwork and designs that work on this small scale
- · Postcard-sized pieces of white card or blank index cards
- Marker pens
- Pencils
- Crayons
- Scissors
- · Collage materials (a variety of papers, fabrics, threads, glitter, etc.)
- Glue
- · Watercolor paints and brushes

What you do:

- 1. Choose a passage of Scripture and read it carefully.
- 2. Invite each person to spend time quietly focusing on one of the texts or on a concept in the Bible passage.
- 3. Think about how you might illustrate that verse or concept on a postcard.
- 4. Use the various materials and tools to create a postcard-sized piece of artwork. You can draw, cut, layer papers, introduce 3-D concepts, and make collages to express your ideas. Or you could use computer graphics and a digital camera to create the image you have in mind.
- 5. When you have finished creating your postcards, show them to each other and say what inspired you to create that postcard and any insights you gained from creating the postcard. How did your ideas about the verse or concept change as you created the card, and how did creating the card help to develop your ideas about the text?
- 6. Find a way to display the cards together. Perhaps they could be mounted on a board or made into an album.

EXPLORING THE BIBLE

Wordless Scriptures

How would you convey some of the ideas in the Bible to someone who did not share your language? Or your culture? Or your faith?

THINGS YOU NEED:

• Bibles

What you do:

- 1. Choose a passage of Scripture and give each person a text to explore.
- 2. Invite each person to find a way to convey the message or meaning to someone who does not speak the same language you speak. What would you do? Perhaps you could draw something, use visual images, use your five senses, or use movement and gesture to convey the meaning.
- Spend some time practicing your gestures or working on how you will convey your ideas.
- 4. Then show what you have created to each other. Can the others understand your meaning? How might you change your gestures to convey a clearer message?
- 5. Talk together about how you can share your faith with the people in your city who have no knowledge of God or the Bible.

Other ideas:

- Make an arrangement of objects or pictures to illustrate the text or concept rather than using gestures.
- For young children, choose simple texts and work together as a family to develop the actions for a Bible verse.







Temperance Award

Build a model

'Smoking Sam'

A basic, easy to make learning aid on the effects of smoking

Materials:

- 1 empty clean, tin food can
- 1 small plastic bag
- 1 elastic band
- Small quality 'blutack' or other adhesive putty
- 1 cigarette

Instructions:

- Use the 'Smoking Sam' in an outdoor area
- Bore hole in closed end of tin can, large enough to hold the cigarette
- Place the bag carefully over the open end of the tin and secure with the elastic band, make sure the bag has some air in it
- Light the cigarette and push into the hole and seal around the cigarette with the 'blutack' or putty
- Squeeze the bag and the suction should make the cigarette 'smoke'
- Experiment first to make sure it works properly!

Ideas for Use:

- Cut open the filters of several cigarettes and show what happens to them
- Tape them to a sheet of cardboard with descriptions by the Adventurers on the effects of smoking

Know and explain your national flag...

Officially known as the Union Flag, the flag of <u>United Kingdom</u> is popularly known as Union Jack. The full name of United Kingdom is United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland. Great Britain consists of England, Scotland and Wales. United Kingdom is simply referred to as UK in common parlance. Wales is not currently represented in the flag of United Kingdom because it was part of <u>England</u> when the first version of the flag was designed.



The national flag of the United Kingdom is also known as the Union Jack. Some member counties of the Commonwealth also use the British flag in the corner of their flags.

When the first flag was created in 1606, it was known simply as 'the flag of Britain' or 'the British flag'.

Designed over 200 years ago, the flag of the United Kingdom that we know today dates from 1801, the year in which Ireland was united with Britain. However, before 1603, the Union Jack was very different than today's flag. England, Scotland and Ireland were separate nations, each of them having their own individual flags.

The Union Jack, one of the world's most recognizable flags, combines the symbols of England's patron saint St. George (red cross on a white background), Scotland's patron saint St. Andrew (diagonal white on blue) and Ireland's patron saint San Patricio (diagonal red cross on white). Wales is not shown on the flag of the United Kingdom because, when the first version of the flag was created in 1606, Wales was part of England. The original flag of United Kingdom was much larger in size than those of the US flag and the flags of many other <u>countries</u>.


Evolution to the Flag

The Union flag has undergone many changes since the first official flag of 1606. After the death of Queen Elizabeth I of England in 1603, King James VI of Scotland became ruler of England and came to be known as King James I of England. Since Queen Elizabeth was unmarried, she wanted King James VI, her cousin to succeed her.

In order to represent the union between these two countries, King James I, hit upon the idea of commissioning a new flag in 1606. The first version of the British flag came into being in 1606. When Ireland became a part of Great Britain in 1801, the British Flag was redesigned to include the Cross of St. Patrick, the patron saint of Ireland. It is in this form that the British flag that we know today exists. In 1921, when Ireland gained independence from United Kingdom, the cross representing Ireland continued to remain on the flag because Northern Ireland was a part of Britain at that time.

When is the Union Jack flown?

The flag should be displayed on government buildings on days marking Remembrance Day, Coronation Day, Commonwealth Day, official birthday of the Queen and on the days of the prorogation of Parliament and State Opening.



Group Activity Ideas

Travelling in the wagon- To teach the Adventurers what is was like to travel in Ellen White's time.

Adventurers sit on chairs or the floor [as if in a wagon] in front of the leader. Start with 'it is 1880 and we are travelling in the wagon with James and Ellen White. There is no roof and they are sitting on wooden seats When I call out, you must do the following actions. The last on to do the action is 'out'.

Rain- hold put your head and sit there getting soaked and looking miserable

Heat- fan yourself- girls, imagine you are wearing a heavy skirt, a corset and lots of petticoats!

Snow-hug yourself tightly and brush off the snow


Wind- hold onto your hat [boys] or bonnet [girls] and keep your head down

Cross the frozen river- listen for the loud cracking of frozen ice and if you hear 'crack' start swimming, girls, imagine you are wearing a heavy skirt, a corset and lots of petticoats!

Sneaking up the steps – One Adventurer is Martin Luther with a sheet of paper and some tape or BluTack. He/she has to creep up to 'nail' the list on the 'door'. Without being caught by the rest of the Adventurers as the 'Soldiers'
